Future Plans on ISSF Finals and ISSF Rules

The Executive Committee further considered the large number of comments sent in by shooters, coaches and officials regarding proposals to change the ISSF finals. A satisfactory solution to this challenge has yet to be found and this effort is ongoing. The Committee received a new report from the Technical Committee regarding proposals for rule changes for the 2005-2008 Olympic cycle. The Committee considered with great interest the more than 80 comments received concerning rifle clothing. The conclusion was to recommend to the ISSF Administrative Council that rules for shooting jackets and shoes remain as they are currently and that current shooting trousers be allowed for the kneeling position only, but not in the standing or prone positions. These recommendations further provide that blinders attached to the hat headband or cap will be permitted. Side blinders can be no more than 40 mm deep and extend no further forward than a line from the center of the forehead. Blinders used to cover the non-aiming eye can be no wider than 30 mm wide. Blinders may no longer be attached to the rifle or rear sight. This will assure that television cameras can view the shooters' faces.

Canadian Smallbore Rifle Nationals

The 2003 Canadian Rifle Nationals were held in Calgary, Alberta from July 13th to 20th at the Steve Johnson Range and Huntington Hills Community Center. 11 Saskatchewan athletes took part at nationals this year: Nicole Bergeron, Emma Day, Phillip Harder, Teresa Hill, Scott Illingworth, James Leuschen, Matt McDermott, Adam Neish, Cory Niefer, Samuel Pidwerbeski, and Neil Suttill.

We arrived early enough to get in some quality practice time at the Steve Johnson Range, however the ISSF matches were shot first so Neil decided to make the trek later in the week. Three relays of prone were shot first with Emma taking 2nd in Marksman.

The Dewar Match took place after the prone. Cory was the only one who competed in this event, but we had a great time watching, as several of us had never seen this type of match.

Three-position was shot next. We experienced some rain and hail on the second day of this event, but thankfully this was the only day we had poor weather. Emma placed 1st in Marksman in this event. In aggregate Emma also took 1st and Teresa took third in Marksman.

Air rifle was shot at the Huntington Hills Community Center. Scott Illingworth made his way down from the Pistol Nationals, which were being held in Edmonton, and Samuel Pidwerbeski also came out to compete in this event. Cory finished third in the open category and top Canadian male. Teresa brought home a 2nd in Expert and Adam took a 1st in Marksman.

The 3-position team of Cory, Emma, and Phillip took a 3rd place finish. The air rifle team of Cory, Teresa, and Emma took home 1st place, while the air rifle – tier 1 team of Cory, Emma, Teresa, Phillip, and Adam took home 2nd. The junior air rifle team of Emma and Teresa took 3rd place.

When the smoke settled we found out that Cory made national “A” team in 3-position in addition to air rifle, and Phillip made 3-position national junior team. This is Phillip’s first time on a national team! Way to go guys!

Neil Suttill was on fire in the sporter categories, bringing home a 3rd in the prone and 3-position master, as well as a 3rd in aggregate. Neil also took part in the team events and brought back a 3rd in prone with Melissa Morris, B. Nieuwenhuis, and Robert Johnson. This same team won 2nd place in the 3-position event.

Between matches we had time to visit with Leonard Strumpf and Reg Potter who came out to show their support! A big thank you goes out to both of you!

We were able to take the association’s Suburban to the competition along with the trailer. This worked great and made traveling a lot more enjoyable since we were able to only have to take one vehicle. We really appreciate the support that the SPSBA gives us.

Overall this was a successful competition for us with everyone getting valuable competition experience.

The National Silhouette Rifle Championships

The Nationals were to be held in Kamloops, BC this year of 2003. Shooters from Ontario, Saskatchewan, Alberta, BC, Yukon and United States traveled to Heffley Creek Gun Club, north of Kamloops. On the way, some travelers were diverted from intended routes by forest fires. Many of the competitors were already at camp at the range, when fires broke out in the area. Match director Bob Brown saw what was happening and advised the campers to move out because the forestry department likely did not know there were people in that area. The campers moved to the Costco parking lot in Kamloops to wait for the rest of the people coming. On the way, we were trying to contact someone to see what was happening, but could not find anyone on phone. We finally tried Tourism, and they directed us to the Costco parking lot. Because of the fires, we had to drive about 300 km extra. Arriving in darkness about 10:00 pm, we were relieved to find many shooters there. There was already talk of going to Cranbrook to hold match there. So in the morning, we had a meeting and it was unanimous, we were going to Cranbrook and the Bull River Shooters Assn range. So another eight hours of driving lay ahead of us. The schedule of matches was delayed by half a day, to give travelers extra time to settle in. We shot the first two matches in the afternoon, finishing up about 7 pm. The rest of the program fell into the regular time frame. The matches ran as smoothly as any, even better, considering the circumstances.

Eight Sask shooters attended the matches. Pawel Proszak was hot, winning High Resident Canadian in SB Sil and SB Hunting rifles. He then went on to win both High Power National Champion titles. I believe this is the first time that this has been achieved by a Canadian resident. Congratulations Pawel, well done!
