## SPSBA Coach's Report

**2005 Nationals Championships:** First off, congratulations to all the athletes that competed at the 2005 National Championships. As always I received many positive comments regarding our teams conduct and performance. One competitor made reference that in a couple of years, "Sask is going to own the Nationals". It is looking this way!

**High Performance/Canadian Sport Center:** This year our association was accredited as a Canadian Sport Center Training Group, partnering with the SFC and the Canadian Sport Center of Sask. Not only is this an exciting look towards our future, but also a respectful indication of the hard work that has been put in place to take us to this point. Many athletes, coaches and administrators have put in a lot of work to get us to a place where we deserve this recognition; please take your bow now!

**2007 Canada Games:** This next training year is, in my mind, the most important year in our 2007 Canada Games athlete development. This is the year that all the foundation is laid down. There are no guarantees in sport, but I do know that the quantity of training that the athletes put in this year will have one of the most significant effects on how they do at the 2007 Canada Games. Our association just received a large grant that will help us to make sure that the athletes have THE BEST equipment on the line at the Games; I encourage all the athletes to get excited and train hard this year. When you get to Canada Games you will want to win, but you can't reinvent this year. You only have one shot at your training this training year, make it worth it, and make yourself proud!

**New way for athletes and coaches to communicate:** We have instituted Training Cards that must be submitted to the coaching staff at the end of each week to report the athlete's previous week of training. This was initiated through a conversation between Coaching Staff and Athletes, trying to find ways to increase communication and motivation. I believe this small step will have dramatic consequences in communication and increasing quantity and quality of the athletes training. It always comes down to the responsibility of the athlete, but as I have been in this position many times, I know how important accountability is! I am excited to see the results this new initiative brings our team.

**Remember the importance of:** I want to end this report with just a small reminder that this team's past successes have been based on Trust of each other (Trust = Honesty + Respect), training harder and smarter than our opponents, gaining quality competition experience and becoming Self – Reliant Athletes. None of these characteristics will continue without hard and smart work. KEEP UP THE GREAT WORK TEAM!

All athletes mentioned accomplished significant personal bests, but the following is a sampling of a few of the outstanding accomplishments by BCRC shooters: Major Trophies were won by Cory Niefer (won the .22 ISSF Rifle Grand Aggregate as well as the Crossman Trophy for Men's Air Rifle Champion) and Drew Schreuder (won the high Junior Award). Drew Schreuder, Matt McDermott and Cory Niefer were also members of the Saskatchewan team that won bronze (prone), silver (3-position), and Gold (air rifle) in the senior men's team events. Drew Schreuder and Matt McDermott also won the Junior Air Rifle Team Event representing Saskatchewan. “Shoot Like a Girl” seemed to be the theme at the The National silhouette rifle championships held near Kamloops, at the beautiful Hefley Creek Range first week of August.

Saskatchewan competitors were Merle Williams, Neil & Patti Suttill, Danny Drager, Guy Wood, Marlin Flavel, Pawel Proszak, and Barrie Gwillim.

Small Bore silhouette was shot the first 3 mornings and s. b. hunting rifle was shot in the afternoons.

Cathy Winstead from Texas was open champion with an incredible 115 out of 120 in small bore. Two of her day scores were 39's!

Pawel was high Canadian with a 94.

I was just short of a bronze medal for AAA Class, losing a shoot-off to Jim Mullins from Idaho with an 83.

In AA, Patti won a shoot-off with Merle Sinoski of BC for the bronze medal with a 73. A class was dominated by Marlin, winning the aggregate with a 55. He started the match as a B, but broke out the first day with at 22, a AA score. Thus, he instantly moved to A.

In small bore hunting rifle, again, Cathy Winstead took open champ with a 108.

Pawel was high Canadian at 97.

I had a 88 which put me down to 5<sup>th</sup> master.

Patti tied for 6<sup>th</sup> place AA.

Marlin was B class Champ with 41.

The weather was ideal, no wind, moderate temperatures, no rain. The hot weather hit for the High Power competition.

As with small bore, H P silhouette rifle was shot in the morning, hunting rifle in the afternoon. Laura Peter from Washington smoked the competition with a nice even 100 to win Open Silhouette Rifle Champion.

Pawel had second best score of 91 to win the Master class, and High Canadian.

My 7 BR was hot, allowing me to win AAA Class with an 82. Barrie, not in best health, finished 4<sup>th</sup> AAA with 55.

Danny won B class with a score of 33, after a shoot off against Larry Salyn, and Guy finished 3<sup>rd</sup> with 27.

In Hunting Rifle, the ladies winning streak was broken, with a guy actually winning! Eric Boos of USA won Open Champion, but only after a wicked shoot-off with Pawel. Both shooters had 85s. So Pawel came home with the Master Champ award and High Canadian.

I took silver medal in AAA after a shoot-off against Larry Steiner with a 61.

Danny's 43 won Bronze medal in A class with Merle coming in 4<sup>th</sup> at 40.

It was a great trip, relaxing for some, a little tense for others, right, Guy? (Guy and Sharon had brake trouble on the way. Yes, in the mountains!)
